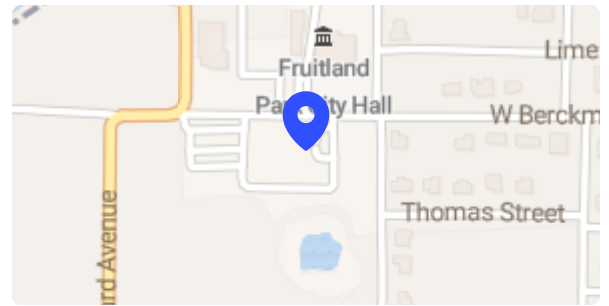

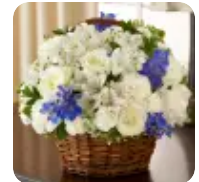
Jan Fraxier Firbird posted:
