Christopher Martineau Coyle (Known as Chris), age 60 passed away unexpectedly on Friday November 10, 2023 in Casselberry Florida. Chris was born on September 11, 1963 in Kirkwood, Missouri to Michael and Mary Coyle. Always intellectually curious and self-sufficient Chris enjoyed Greek and Indian cooking recipes, even working at a Greek restaurant for a period of time in St. Louis, MO. Chris was adventurous and moved around living and working in Houston TX, New Orleans, LA, a short stint in the USMC, and finally Maitland, Florida, where he bought a house and had a career in the Telemarketing industry for a number of years. Chris loved music, writing lyrics, he produced a CD of himself as the sole artist. 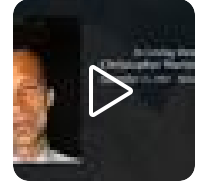
