Carmillo "Carm" S. Malachowski, 72, of Fruitland Park, FL, passed away at Leesburg Regional Medical Center, December 27, 2018. Born in Milwaukee, WI, to Chester and Barbara Malachowski on July 17, 1946.

Carm served in the United States Army, was a veteran of the Vietnam War, and was Honorably discharged on May 21, 1969.
