February 2, 1945 - November 12, 2012

James A. (Jim) Kreeger, age 67, of Leesburg, FL, died Nov. 12, 2012, at Dr. P Phillips Hospital in Orlando, FL. He was born Feb. 2, 1945 in Quincy, IL. He married Charlene Smith July 16, 1966, in LaGrange, MO. They had two daughters, Natalie Kreeger of Rockmart, GA, and Leslie (Kreeger) York of Keller, TX. His daughters were his pride and joy, and he always called them "my heroes". Jim was a Disabled Veteran having served in the US Navy Seabees in Vietnam, Adak Alaska, and other locations around the world. After his Navy career, Jim made his living in outside sales.
